Popular Jobs in Finance

- Financial Analyst A financial analyst advises companies and individuals on their investment decisions by analyzing the performance of stocks, bonds, and other types of investments.
 - Median Salary: \$76,950
 - Job Outlook: 16% growth next 7 years (Faster than Average)
 - Number of Jobs expected in 2022: 292,400
 - Financial analysts typically start by specializing in a specific investment field. As they gain experience, they can become portfolio managers and supervise teams of analysts. They can also become fund managers, who manage large investment portfolios for individual investors.

Popular Jobs in Finance

- **Budget Analyst** Budget analysts help public and private institutions organize their finances. They prepare budget reports and monitor institutional spending.
 - Median Salary: \$69,280
 - Job Outlook: 6% growth next 7 years (slower than average)
 - Number of Jobs expected in 2022 : 65,500
 - At the entry-level, Budget Analysts begin with limited responsibilities but advancement is common. Upon gaining more experience, Analysts have the opportunity to advance into Intermediate and Senior Budget Analyst positions.

Popular Jobs in Finance

- Financial Manager (Branch or Dept.) Direct and coordinate financial activities of workers in a branch, office, or department of an establishment, such as branch bank, brokerage firm, risk and insurance department, or credit department.
 - Median Salary: \$109,740
 - Job Outlook: 9% growth next 7 years (varies by industry)
 - Number of Jobs expected in 2022 : 579,200
 - Financial Managers typically have a bachelor's degree and 5 years or more of experience in a business or financial occupation, such as loan officer, accountant, auditor, securities sales agent, or financial analyst.

Marketing



An MBA concentration in marketing provides the basic concepts, techniques and tools for developing marketing strategy and marketing programs. MBA graduates will be prepared to help organizations decide which consumer groups to serve and which product and services to produce, and to create appropriate promotional, pricing, and distribution arrangements central to profitably generating growth opportunities.

This preparation is relevant for a variety of career paths, including brand/product management, marketing research, new product development, sales force management, advertising, and management consulting

Popular Jobs in Marketing

- Marketing Manager Plan, direct, or coordinate marketing policies and programs, such as determining the demand for products and services offered by a firm and its competitors, and identify potential customers.
 - Median salary: \$119,480
 - Job outlook: 7% growth next 7 years (bit slower than average)
 - Number of Jobs expected in 2022: 203,400
 - Marketing Manager positions are highly desirable and often sought by other experienced professionals. Strong competition is expected. With Internet-based advertising becoming more important, advertising managers who can navigate the digital world should have the best prospects.

Popular Jobs in Marketing

- Market Research Analysts In order to influence marketing strategies, the individuals in this position conduct public opinion surveys to maintain a customer base.
 - Median Salary: \$61,170
 - Job outlook: 32% growth next 7 years (Much faster than average)
 - Expected number of jobs in 2022: 547,200
 - As more companies use research to develop marketing strategies, more competing companies are expected to use this strategy. Those with a strong background in statistical and data analysis or related work experience will have better job opportunities than those without it.

Popular Jobs in Marketing

- Advertising Manager The people in this position oversee various promotional campaigns in order to attract a new customer base and plan programs to generate interest in a product or service
 - Median salary: \$115,750
 - Job outlook: 12% growth next 7 years (about average)
 - Number of jobs expected in 2022: 241,400
 - These managers will be needed to plan, direct, and coordinate campaigns and introduce new products to the marketplace. They will also be needed to manage digital media campaigns targeting customers through websites, social media, or live chats. These managers typically have work experience in advertising, marketing, promotions, or sales.

Jobs Related to Global Business

- International Economist Study the international and domestic markets, they analyze, examine trends, and make projections.
 - Median salary: \$91,860
 - Job outlook: 14% growth next 7 years (about average)
 - Number of jobs expected in 2022: 19,200
 - Businesses and organizations increasingly relying on economic analysis and quantitative methods to analyze and forecast business, sales, and other economic trends. Job prospects should be best for those with a master's degree or Ph.D., strong quantitative and analytical skills, and related work experience.

Jobs Related to Global Business

- Management Analyst/Consultant These individuals analyze company operations to look at efficiencies, examine profit margins, and study the company structure.
 - Median Salary: \$78,600
 - Job outlook: 19% growth next 7 years (faster than average)
 - Number of Jobs expected in 2022: 852,500
 - Consultants often take on more responsibility with experience. At the senior level, consultants may supervise teams and become more involved in seeking out new business. Some may eventually become partners in their consulting organization. Senior consultants who leave their consulting company often move to senior management positions at non-consulting organizations.

Jobs Related to Global Business

- Import/Export Compliance Specialist Maintains the compliance of imports and exports within regulatory law, both domestic and international. Jobs can be found in federal government and private sector.
 - Median Salary: \$68,000
 - Job Outlook: 15% growth next 7 years (about average)
 - Number of jobs expected in 2022: 248,400
 - Top prospects for these types of positions are expected to be wellversed in trade regulations, along with other aspects of importing and exporting goods and services.

Jobs in Leadership and Managing Organizational Change

- Organizational Management Consultant Studies an organization's existing organizational issues and creating a plan of action to remedy these problems and improve the quality of the workplace, efficiency and profits.
 - Median Salary: \$88,000
 - Job Outlook: 22% growth next 7 years (above average)
 - Number of jobs expected in 2022: 817,745
 - Careers in this field should see above-average job growth and lucrative salary potential due to the ongoing need to improve business operations; Positions in organizational management usually require extensive experience with increasing responsibility and proven positive results

Jobs in Leadership and Managing Organizational Change

- Training and Development Manager Direct, develop, implement, and monitor training programs within an organization to enhance the knowledge and skills of its employees.
 - Median Salary: \$95,400
 - Job Outlook: 11% growth next 7 years (about fast as average)
 - Number of jobs expected in 2022: 31,800
 - Those who have a master's degree, certification, or work experience in training and development should have the best job prospects.

Entrepreneurship

Entrepreneurship is, at its core, a creative activity. It involves starting a new venture with an innovative idea — frequently for a market that currently does not exist. As a result, the MBA entrepreneurship concentration is built upon courses designed to help you tap into your creativity, and then translate your creative vision into a real business that not only produces wealth, but also allows you to express your personal values.

Your first steps include two courses to assist you in discovering your own brainchild— a personally compelling venture idea with large market potential. These are followed by three courses to help you flesh out a business model that will generate profits, build your organization and make connection with your market. Your final step is a course that pulls it all together, resulting in a business plan that you present to a panel of angel and venture capital investors.

ENTR 661 and ENTR 662 must be taken in sequence and precede the other courses. ENTR 667 is a capstone course which must be taken upon completion of the other five courses. ENTR 663, ENTR 664, and ENTR 665 may be taken concurrently or in any order but are best taken in sequence starting with ENTR 663, followed by ENTR 664, and ending with ENTR 665. The global business requirement is fulfilled by completing the Entrepreneurship concentration.

Jobs in Entrepreneurship

- Entrepreneur/Small Business Owner Entrepreneurs are responsible for starting and managing all aspects of a business, from inventory control to marketing and staffing.
 - Salaries can vary enormously for a variety of factors. Studies show that the average small business owner earns about \$68,000.
 - Majority of entrepreneurs create and manage their own businesses and companies, but some choose to work with small businesses to help them become successful. Job titles include consultant, strategic planner, specialist and manager, among others.

Jobs in Entrepreneurship

- General/Operations Manager This is the top manager for public or private sector organizations. The general manager is in charge of overseeing the revenue and costs of an establishment and making decisions about direction and goals.
 - Median Salary: \$96,430
 - Job outlook: 11% growth next 7 years (about fast as average)
 - Number of jobs expected in 2022: 2,216,800
 - The high pay and prestige associated with these positions attract many qualified applicants. Those with an advanced degree and extensive managerial experience will have the best job prospects. Education requirements vary by industry, but candidates who can demonstrate strong leadership abilities and experience getting positive results will have better job opportunities.

Dispute Resolution



Recognizing that problem-solving skills and deal-making are essential management tools, the Graziadio School, in conjunction with the Straus Institute for Dispute Resolution , provides MBA students an opportunity to study in Pepperdine School of Law's internationally recognized Dispute Resolution program while fulfilling MBA requirements.

An arm of the Pepperdine University School of Law C, the Straus Institute offers two tracks of study for MBA students: individual courses in dispute resolution or a 12-unit curriculum that allows students to earn an MBA with a Concentration in Dispute Resolution.

MBA students who complete an additional 2-unit elective at the Straus Institute, which would not count toward their MBA degree, would be awarded a Certificate in Dispute Resolution I from the Straus Institute, School of Law.

The Straus Institute offers the most extensive law school dispute resolution curriculum in the country and is annually recognized by U.S. News & World Report as a prominent leader in this field.

Popular Jobs in Dispute Resolution

- Arbitrator/Mediator/Conciliator Help resolve conflicts outside of the court system by facilitating negotiation and dialogue between disputing parties. Prepares settlement agreements for disputants to sign.
 - Median Salary: \$61,280
 - Job Outlook: 10% growth next 7 years (about fast as average)
 - Number of jobs expected in 2022: 9,300
- Dispute resolution methods are often seen as faster and less expensive than trials and litigation. Because this position often deals with legal issues and disputes, those with a legal background or law degree may have better job prospects.

Popular Jobs in Dispute Resolution

- Labor Relations Manager Responsible for negotiating agreements between a company and a labor organization or individual employees. Negotiate collective bargaining agreements, or coordinate grievance procedures to handle employee complaints.
 - Median Salary: \$106,584
 - Job Outlook: 7% growth next 7 years (bit slower than average)
 - Number of jobs expected in 2022: 76,900
 - The best job prospects will have skills such as outstanding communication, analytical thinking, attention to detail and the ability to maintain relationships. A professional and calm demeanor, collaborative work style and respect for diverse populations are essential.

Popular Jobs in Dispute Resolution

- **Contract Administrator** Responsible for preparing, examining, analyzing, negotiating, and revising contracts that involve the purchase or sale of goods and services.
 - Median Salary: \$60,450
 - Job Outlook:15% growth next 7 years (about average)
 - Number of jobs expected in 2022: 145,935
 - A general knowledge of contractual agreement language and law is essential for contract administrators; good oral and written communication skills are beneficial, especially when preparing presentations and documents. Leadership and an understanding of interpersonal relationships may be helpful during the negotiating process.

Digital Innovation and Information Systems

As organizations become increasingly reliant on digital technologies in their operations, products and processes, a critical need has emerged for professionals who bring deep understanding of technology management and the opportunities for digital innovation in business. Such individuals will be best positioned for career success by acquiring a comprehensive mix of business, technology and managerial knowledge and competencies.

The MBA concentration in Digital Innovation and Information Systems (DIIS) focuses on bridging the gap between business and technology, giving graduates a distinct advantage in the marketplace. Surveys of IT management indicate a persistent concern for achieving alignment between business needs and technology resources. Additionally, CIOs affirm that significant improvement is needed for managers who possess the knowledge and skills to envision, manage, and lead initiatives that span the realms of business, IT, and innovation.

Jobs in Digital Innovation and Information Systems

- Business Intelligence Analyst Uses advanced analytical methods to help organizations investigate complex issues, identify and solve problems, and make better decisions.
 - Median Salary: \$72,100
 - Job Outlook: 27% growth next 7 years (much faster than average)
 - Number of jobs expected in 2022: 92,700
- Some business may require a graduate degree in business or computers as well as several years of experience. Gaining experience in an internship or entry level role can allow you to develop certain skills that are necessary to thrive in this position. Skills like analytics and communication will need to be top notch when applying for a position in this field.

Jobs in Digital Innovation and Information Systems

- Information Systems Manager Plan, coordinate, and direct computer-related activities in an organization. They help determine the information technology goals of an organization and are responsible for implementing systems to meet those goals.
 - Median Salary: \$120,950
 - Job Outlook: 15% growth next 7 years (bit faster than average)
 - Number of jobs expected in 2022: 383,600
 - These managers usually start out at a lower level and advance to higher positions within the IT department. IT Directors or project managers can advance to become CTOs. A CTO or other manager who is business minded can advance to become a Chief Information Officer (CIO) in charge of all IT-related decisions. CIOs can advance to become top executives in an organization.

Jobs in Digital Innovation and Information Systems

- Technology Product Manager Develop strategies to meet customer demands, implementing the latest technology to improve products.
 - Median Salary: \$97,648
 - Jobs expected to grow at more than an above average rate as the need for modern technology advances. The number of products and services competing for American dollars will likely increase in coming years, fueling the need for more Technology Product Managers.
